in a lengthy introduction warraq notes that historical and linguistic evidence suggests that there was considerable confusion regarding what should be included in the koran in the early years of muslim history although the caliph uthman canonized a specific text some fifteen years after the death of muhammad variant readings of certain passages have persisted to the present this can be seen in discrepancies between the two main printed versions of the koran available today the warsh transmission found in west and northwest africa and the hafs transmission stemming from kufa an important center of koranic scholarship located in iraq and widely available through the standard egyptian edition of 1924 in addition the hadith a revered collection of muslim secondary literature on the life of muhammad discusses missing koranic verses and even muhammad s sometimes faulty memory such evidence strongly indicates that the koran cannot be considered an inerrant revelation back cover

widely considered to be one of the greatest quran reciters of the modern era abdul basit abdu samad received the global acclaim that no other quran reciter has received to this day born in 1927 in a village in upper egypt he finished memorising the entire quran by heart at the tender age of ten he also learnt the seven styles of quran recitation by the age of twelve and the ten styles of quran recitation by the age of fourteen in 1951 at the age of nineteen he went to the capital cairo for the first time and recited the quran at zaynab mosque it was an event where many famous quran reciters were present his performance was so outstanding that the crowd requested him to recite beyond his allocated ten minutes in fact he continued to recite for over an hour and a half there began his journey of ascension in the same year he started reciting the quran on egyptian national radio abdul basit later went on to win three international quran competitions in the seventies and toured the world mesmerising audiences with his breathtaking recitation he was the founding president of the union of quran reciters in egypt he was dubbed the golden throat and the voice of heaven due to his melodious style remarkable breath control and unique emotional and engaging tone his legacy remains unmatched as quran reciters across the world attempt to imitate his unique and mesmerising style this profile charts his journey from a village in upper egypt to international fame and recognition

transmission of the qur an during the first centuries of islam the palimpsest contains two superimposed qur anic texts within two layers of writing on thirty eight leaves of parchment collectively numbered ms 01 27 1 in the dar al makhtutat lit the house of manuscripts in sanaa yemen the palimpsest s lower text which has been dated to the first century of islam seventh century ce was subsequently erased and the parchment was later reused for writing another qur anic text which remains visible in natural light this upper text is thought to date from the second century of islam eighth century ce the two layers were imaged in 2007 by a french italian mission both qur anic texts are fragmented and present aspects of work in progress in its lower layer the manuscript offers the oldest witness of a reading instruction in a qur an text and perhaps even in any arabic text such peculiarities offer rare evidence as to how the qur an was transmitted taught and written down in the first centuries of islam in this book asma hilali presents an annotated edition of the texts together with a critical introduction these contextualise the volume within the field of qur an manuscript studies and engage with the historical and institutional contexts of transmission of the qur anic passages the volume also makes systematic reference to previous studies and partial editions of the same manuscript
