This book presents two approaches: the traditional IS-LM analysis under the assumption that the money supply is exogenous because the central bank uses its monetary policy to control it, and the emerging IS-RT analysis under the assumption that the interest rate is the exogenous monetary policy variable set by the central bank to manipulate aggregate demand in the economy. The IS-RT analysis is important for the macro analyses of many economies yet is totally neglected in most textbooks on macroeconomics. The chapter on paradigms in economics introduces students to the heritage of ideas in macroeconomics and the evolution of ideas and approaches over the last two centuries.
