rhetoric broadly conceived as the art of making things matter is both a practice and theory about that practice in recent decades scholars of rhetoric have turned to approaches that braid together poetics performance and philosophy into a practical art by practical art they mean methods tested in practice by trial and error with a goal of offering something useful and teachable this volume presents just such an account of rhetoric the account here does not turn away from theory but rather presumes and incorporates
