acquiring a highly destructive tool the adversary would demonstrate an inability of the united states to protect its nuclear assets the united states expends considerable resources toward maintaining effective security at facilities that house its nuclear assets however particularly in a budget constrained environment it is essential that these assets are also secured efficiently meaning at reasonable cost and imposing minimal burdens on the primary missions of the organizations that operate u s nuclear facilities it is in this context that the u s congress directed the national nuclear security administration nnsa a semi autonomous agency in the u s department of energy doe responsible for securing nuclear weapons and significant quantities of snm asked the national academies for advice on augmenting its security approach particularly on the applicability of quantitative and other risk based approaches for securing its facilities in carrying out its charge the committee has focused on what actions nnsa could take to make its security approach more effective and efficient the committee concluded that the solution to balancing cost security and operations at facilities in the nuclear weapons complex is not to assess security risks more quantitatively or more precisely this is primarily because there is no comprehensive analytical basis for defining the attack strategies that a malicious creative and deliberate adversary might employ or the probabilities associated with them however using structured thinking processes and techniques to characterize security risk could improve nnsa s understanding of security vulnerabilities and guide more effective resource allocation

a major issue in the cleanup of this country s nuclear weapons complex is how to dispose of the radioactive waste resulting primarily from the chemical processing operations for the recovery of plutonium and other defense strategic nuclear materials the wastes are stored in hundreds of large underground tanks at four u s department of energy doe sites throughout the united states the tanks contain hundreds of thousands of cubic meters of radioactive and hazardous waste most of it is high level waste hlw some of it is transuranic tru or low level waste llw and essentially all containing significant amounts of chemicals deemed hazardous of the 278 tanks involved about 70 are known or assumed to have leaked some of their contents to the environment the remediation of the tanks and their contents requires the development of new technologies to enable cleanup and minimize costs while meeting various health safety and environmental objectives while doe has a process based on stakeholder participation for screening and formulating technology needs it lacks transparency in terms of being apparent to all concerned decision makers and other interested parties and a systematic basis in terms of identifying end states for the contaminants and developing pathways to these states from the present conditions an end state methodology for identifying technology needs for environmental management with an example from the hanford site tanks describes an approach for identifying technology development needs that is both systematic and transparent to enhance the cleanup and remediation of the tank contents and their sites the authoring committee believes that the recommended end state based approach can be applied to doe waste management in general not just to waste in tanks the approach is illustrated through an example based on the tanks at the doe hanford site in southeastern washington state the location of some 60 percent by volume of the tank waste residues

the speed with which the treasury had to set up a scheme to make payments to former policyholders of equitable life impeded its ability to design one which worked efficiently and effectively according to the national audit office the data for making payments was old and incomplete and many practical issues had to be overcome including having to trace over one million people and confirm their identity as there is still a large number of payments to be made the scheme runs the risk of failing to meet payment targets and overrunning on costs the nao recognizes that the treasury was given a difficult challenge in setting up the payment scheme it had to set up a complex operation in a short period of time so that the first payments could be made by june 2011 but not enough preparation work was done before the scheme went live it was initially planned that 500 million should have been paid out by the end of 2011 12 this target was not met by march 2013 the scheme had made 407 000 payments totalling 577 million the scheme has made only 35 per cent of its total payments and spent 72 per cent of its original administration budget the scheme s objective of paying all traced former policyholders by the end of march 2014 is at risk the treasury plans to close the scheme in april 2014 having made all the payments to investors and groups and the first two annual payments to those who held an annuity however a large number of payments remain to be made in the final year of the scheme

literature and sensitizing concepts to help extend and explore the data the analysis focused on six perspectives of the complex adaptive system and new insights emerged through realist inductive abductive deductive and retroductive inferential processes this study asserts a definition of leadership as an emergent temporal social systems phenomenon independent of the actions and capacities of individuals further ngo leadership emerges from the activity ngos perform in the system i e advocacy ngo leadership in this context is an emergent function dependent on the ngo s structure and structural outsider position within this complex adaptive system it is expressed as a social learning process employed collaboratively to achieve chronic disease prevention aims the theory asserts specific conditions that must exist at organizational and inter organizational coalition levels to allow the emergence of ngo leadership this study concludes by opening new possibilities for the exploration of leadership beyond the actions and capacities of individuals to frame leadership as an emergent temporal social phenomenon in complex adaptive systems

one of the highest priority activities in the planetary sciences identified in published reports of the space studies board s committee on planetary and lunar exploration complex and in reports of other advisory groups is the collection and return of extraterrestrial samples to earth for study in terrestrial laboratories in response to recommendations made in such studies nasa has initiated a vigorous program that will within the next decade collect samples from a variety of solar system environments in particular the mars exploration program is expected to launch spacecraft that are designed to collect samples of martian soil rocks and atmosphere and return them to earth perhaps as early as 2015 international treaty obligations mandate that nasa conduct such a program in a manner that avoids the cross contamination of both earth and mars the space studies board s 1997 report mars sample return issues and recommendations examined many of the planetary protection issues concerning the back contamination of earth and concluded that although the probability that martian samples will contain dangerous biota is small it is not zero 1 steps must be taken to protect earth against the remote possibility of contamination by life forms that may have evolved on mars similarly the samples collected at great expense must be protected against contamination by terrestrial biota and other matter almost certainly meeting these requirements will entail opening the sample return container in an appropriate facility on earth presumably a bsl 4 laboratory where testing biosafety certification and quarantine of

the samples will be carried out before aliquots are released to the scientific community for study in existing laboratory facilities the nature of the required quarantine facility and the decisions required for disposition of samples once they are in it were regarded as issues of sufficient importance and complexity to warrant a study by the committee on planetary and lunar exploration complex in isolation from other topics previous studies have been much broader including also consideration of the mission that collects samples on mars and brings them to earth atmospheric entry sample recovery and transport to the quarantine facility the charge to complex stated that the central question to be addressed in this study is the following what are the criteria that must be satisfied before martian samples can be released from a quarantine facility
