Landscapes and Voices of the Great War 2018-08-22 this volume aims to provide a wider view of first world war experience through focusing on landscapes less commonly considered in historiography and on voices that have remained on the margins of popular understanding of the war the landscape of the western front was captured during the conflict in many different ways in photographs paintings and print the most commonly replicated voicing of contemporary attitudes towards the war is that of initial enthusiasm giving way to disillusionment and a sense of overwhelming futility investigations of the many components of war experience drawn from social and cultural history have looked to landscapes and voices beyond the frontline as a means of foregrounding different perspectives on the war not all of the voices presented here opposed the war and not all of the landscapes were comprised of trenches or flanked by barbed wire collectively they combine to offer further fresh insights into the multiplicity of war experience an alternate space to the familiar tropes of mud and mayhem

Voices of War 2006 usbby outstanding international books honor list in this book deborah ellis turns her attention to the most tragic victims of the iraq war iraqi children she interviews young people mostly refugees living in jordan but also a few who are trying to build new lives in north america some families have left iraq with money others are penniless and ill or disabled most of the children have parents who are working illegally or not at all and the fear of deportation is a constant threat ellis provides an historical overview and brief explanations of context but other than that allows the children to speak for themselves with minimal editorial comment or interference their stories are frank harrowing and sometimes show surprising resilience as the children try to survive the consequences of a war in which they played no part a glossary map and suggestions for further information are included

Voices of War 2006 voices of the vietnam war is an oral history told by the soldiers who fought and others who were impacted by the fighting halfway around the world most especially the wives and siblings who waited at home this book listens to two people who were against the war and had to take their own philosophical stand often against their own families and friends the book features chapters personally written by three military veterans two wives tell the story of how they waited at home while their husbands fought in vietnam relying on letters and television news for information decorated combat officer david christian is the strongest voice in the book describing his unit s war experiences and then detailing the loss of his brother doug to agent orange linked cancer christian became a leading advocate for veterans disability pensions and helped gain government approval for agent orange benefits vietnam war veteran terry nau wrote and edited this book his fifth on the subject he interviewed soldiers from his artillery unit high school friends who went to war and also convinced acquaintances to tell their own story in their own words

The Voices of War 1972 at 7 30 a m on saturday 1 july 1916 the british expeditionary force rose from its trenches and stepped into a blizzard of fire that would echo for generations to come setting out that day were regiments from every part of the country but with no fewer than twenty nine battalions yorkshire contributed the largest contingent and the county s close knit mill towns and pit villages paid a heavy price two months later zeppelins brought the war to streets still mourning their dead and added women and children to the growing casualty lists this was total war using letters diaries archives newspapers and local histories yorkshire s war tells the story of a county at war of children sewing sandbags of old men guarding the coast of young men going off to war and of their wives mothers and sweethearts finding new ways to cope with near starvation rations the constant fear for their loved ones and finding strength in the new roles opening up for them this is their story

The Lost Voices of World War I 1998-01-01 nine rare and fascinating first person profiles of soldiers who fought for the british crown much has been written about the colonists who took up arms during the american revolution and the army they created far less literature however has been devoted to their adversaries the professional soldiers that composed the british army are seldom considered on a personal level instead being either overlooked or inaccurately characterized as conscripts and criminals most of the british redcoats sent to america in defense of their government s policies were career soldiers who enlisted voluntarily in their late teens or early twenties they came from all walks of british life including those with nowhere else to turn those aspiring to improve their social standing and all others in between statistics show that most were simply hardworking men with various amounts of education who had chosen the military in preference to other occupations very few of these soldiers left writings from which we can learn their private motives and experiences british soldiers american war voices of the american revolution is the first collection of personal narratives by british common soldiers ever assembled and published author don n hagist has located first hand accounts of nine soldiers who served in america in the 1770s and 1780s in their own words we learn of the diverse population among them a former weaver a boy who quarelled with his family and a man with wanderlust who joined the army and served tirelessly and dutifully sometimes faithfully and sometimes irresolutely in the uniform of their nation to accompany each narrative the author provides a contextualizing essay based on archival research giving background on the soldier and his military service taken as a whole these true stories reveal much about the individuals who composed what was at the time the most formidable fighting force in the world
