the rich indian medical tradition is usually traced back to sanskrit sources the earliest of which cannot much antedate the common era in this book kenneth zysk shows that buddhist scriptures some centuries older than this contain abundant information about medical practice and are our earliest evidence for a rational approach to medicine in india he argues that buddhism and the medical tradition were mutually supportive that buddhist monks and people associated with them contributed to the development of medicine while their skills as physical as well as spiritual healers enhanced their reputation and popular support drawing on a wide range of textual archaeological and secondary sources zysk first presents an overview of the history of indian medicine in its religious context he then examines primary literature from the pali buddhist canon and from the sanskrit treatises of bhela caraka and susruta by close comparison of these two bodies of literature zysk convincingly shows how the theories delineated in the medical classics actually became practice

tracking dr lonecloud showman to legend keeper by ruth whitehead nova scotia museum ethnologist is a book that includes the memoir of jerry lonecloud a mi kmaw hunter healer and showman co published by goose lane editions and the nova scotia museum the book offers to readers for the first time the earliest known mi kmaw memoir jerry lonecloud was born germain laski on 4 july 1852 in belfast maine to mi kmaw parents from nova scotia as a youth he lived in vermont orphaned at the age of fourteen he set out on a two year adventure to bring his two brothers and one sister back to nova scotia trained in the use of herbal medicine by his parents laski fell easily into the role of doctor lonecloud in the american medicine shows of the 1880s including healey and bigelow s kickapoo indian medicine company buffalo bill s wild west show and his own company the kiowa medicine show for which he made the medicines during the rest of his remarkable life he sold tonics in south america prospected for gold and guided sportsmen into the woods of maritime canada as they searched for moose and caribou hunter healer and showman lonecloud valued studied preserved and passed on many of the traditional ways stories and natural medicines of his people during doctor lonecloud s travels he gained a great amount of personal knowledge of different cultures and in return he shared his vast knowledge of the mi kmaw people notes donald julien executive director of the confederacy of mainland mi kmaq in the book s preface a researcher himself julien has found lonecloud s name on hundreds of government documents in the provincial and national archives the story of his many trips from childhood to when he left this world to join our ancestors is very intriguing said julien after lonecloud met harry piers curator of the provincial museum of nova scotia in 1910 the two developed a friendship that continued until lonecloud s death in 1930 lonecloud s great knowledge of natural and social history is reflected in the specimens and artifacts he brought to the museum and in piers s meticulous notes on the information lonecloud provided about the items near the end of his life lonecloud told journalist clara dennis his own story and a wealth of mi kmaw tales oral histories jokes and social customs many previously undocumented unpublished until now this treasure of information recorded between 1923 and 1929 forms the basis of this book

the purpose of this book says the author is to show the effect of indian medicinal practices on white civilization actually it achieves far more it discusses indian theories of disease and methods of combating disease and even goes into the question of which diseases were indigenous and which were brought to the indian by the white man it also lists indian drugs that have won acceptance in the pharmacopeia of the united states and the national formulary the influence of american indian healing arts on the medicine and healing and pharmacology of the white man was considerable for example such drugs as insulin and penicillin were anticipated in rudimentary form by the aborigines coca leaves were used as narcotics by peruvian indians hundreds of years before carl koller first used cocaine as a local anesthetic in 1884 all together about 170 medicines mostly botanical were contributed to the official compendia by indians north of the rio grande about 50 more coming from natives of the latin american and caribbean regions impressions and attitudes of early explorers settlers physicians botanists and others regarding indian curative practices are reported by geographical regions with british french and spanish colonies and the young united states separately treated indian theories of disease sorcery taboo violation spirit intrusion soul loss unfulfilled dreams and desires and so on and shamanistic practices used to combat them are described methods of treating all kinds of injuries from fractures to snakebite and even surgery are included the influence of indian healing lore upon folk or domestic medicine as well as on the indian doctors and patent medicines are discussed for the convenience of the reader an index of botanical names is provided together with a wide variety of illustrations the disproportionate attention that has been given to the superstitious and unscientific features of aboriginal medicine has tended to obscure its real contributions to american civilization

how smallpox or variola caused widespread devastation during the european colonization of the americas is a well known story but as historian paul kelton informs us that s precisely what it is a convenient story in cherokee medicine colonial germs kelton challenges the virgin soil thesis or the widely held belief that natives lack of immunities and their inept healers were responsible for their downfall eschewing the metaphors and hyperbole routinely associated with the impact of smallpox he firmly shifts the focus to the root cause of indigenous suffering and depopulation colonialism writ large not disease kelton s account begins with the long false dawn between 1518 and the mid seventeenth century when sporadic encounters with europeans did little to bring cherokees into the wider circulation of guns goods and germs that had begun to transform native worlds by the 1690s english inspired slave raids had triggered a massive smallpox epidemic that struck the cherokees for the first time through the eighteenth century cherokees repeatedly responded to real and threatened epidemics and they did so effectively by drawing on their own medicine yet they also faced terribly destructive physical violence from the british during the anglo cherokee war 1759 1761 and from american militias during the revolutionary war having suffered much more from the scourge of war than from smallpox the cherokee population rebounded during the nineteenth century and without abandoning native medical practices and beliefs cherokees took part in the nascent global effort to eradicate variola by embracing vaccination a far more complex and nuanced history of variola among american indians emerges from these pages one that privileges the lived experiences of the cherokees over the story of their supposedly ill equipped immune systems and counterproductive responses cherokee medicine colonial germs shows us how europeans and their american descendants have obscured the past with the stories they left behind and how these stories have perpetuated a simplistic understanding of colonialism

well mannered medicine explores the moral discourses on the practice of medicine in the foundational texts of ayurveda the classical ayurvedic treatises were composed in sanskrit between the first and the seventh centuries ce and later works dating into the sixteenth century ce are still considered strongly authoritative as wujastyk shows these works testify to an elaborate system of medical ethics and etiquette physicians looked to the ayurvedic treatises for a guide to professional conduct ayurvedic discourses on good medical practice depict the physician as highly educated skilled moral and well mannered the rules of conduct positioned physicians within mainstream society and characterized medical practice as a trustworthy and socially acceptable profession at the same time professional success was largely based on a particular physician s ability to cure his patients this resulted in tension as some treatments and medications were considered socially or religiously unacceptable doctors needed to treat their patients successfully while ostensibly following the rules of acceptable behavior wujastyk offers insight into the many unorthodox methods of avoiding conflict while ensuring patient compliance shown in the ayurvedic treatises giving a disarmingly candid perspective on the realities of medical practice and its crucial role in a profoundly well mannered society
