The Catholic Martyrs of the Twentieth Century 2006

from the catholic martyrs at auschwitz and dachau to oscar romero in el salvador from ita ford and her murdered companions to the recent killings of christians in india pakistan and sudan it is estimated that more than one million christian have died for their faith in the twentieth century because the catholic church is the largest single denomination in the world a substantial portion of those martyrs has been catholic in his encyclical anticipating the third millennium pope john paul ii has reminded the world that the century s religious victims catholics protestants jews and others are

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a special witness for our time that must not be forgotten the twentieth century made great strides in science and technology and spread the notion of basic human rights to all parts of the globe but alongside these solid achievements it was also a period of unprecedented religious persecution that surpassed even the early years of the church most accounts of the modern age document how ideological movements and brutal dictatorships killed millions around the world for political social racial and ethnic reasons almost no attention has been paid however to the specifically anti religious nature of many of these same modern regimes robert royal presents the first comprehensive history of the twentieth century martyrs religious persecution and martyrdom touched virtually every continent during this century in addition to the massive slaughters of believers under nazism and communism this volume traces specific situations in africa mexico central america asia the middle east and europe which produced a large harvest of heroic witnesses to the faith it offers detailed accounts of how martyrdoms occurred and studies the political system and other factors that contributed to various confrontations over religion a rich collection of individual biographies ranging from bishops and clergy to the bloody fates of ordinary lay people is woven into the text

The Saints and Martyrs of Ireland 1981

the influence of the irish saints and martyrs on the christian church cannot be overestimated there has been a tradition of irish saints for more than 1800 years although there are only five canonized irish saints there are thousands that have been sanctified by tradition and the devotion of centuries and who are often curiously better known in the rest the world than in ireland itself montague traces the history of irish sanctity from the second century a d to the 20th covering the golden age of irish

during and immediately after the first world war there was a merging of christian and nationalist traditions of martyrdom expressed in the design of war cemeteries and war memorials and the state funeral of the unknown warrior in 1920 john wolffe explores the subsequent development of these traditions of sacred and secular martyrdom analysing the ways in which they operated sometimes in parallel sometimes merged together and sometimes in conflict with each other particular topics explored include the protestant commemoration of marian and missionary martyrs and the roman catholic campaign for the canonization of the saints and martyrs of england secular martyrdom is discussed in relation to military conflicts especially the second world war and the falklands in ireland there was a particularly persistent merging of sacred and secular martyrdom in the wake of the easter rising of 1916 although by the time of the northern ireland troubles in the later twentieth century these traditions diverged in covering these themes the book also offers historical and comparative context for understanding present day acts of martyrdom in the form of suicide attacks

Cox's Book of Modern Saints and Martyrs 2006-07-04

The Martyrdom of the Franciscans 2020-03-06

while hagiographies tell of christian martyrs who have died in an astonishing number of ways and places slain by members of many different groups martyrdom in a franciscan context generally meant death at muslim hands indeed in franciscan discourse death by saracen came to rival or even surpass other definitions of what made a martyr the centrality of islam to franciscan conceptions of martyrdom becomes even more apparent and problematic when we realize that many of the martyr narratives were largely invented franciscan authors were free to choose the antagonist they wanted

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christopher macevitt observes and they almost always chose muslims however martyrdom in franciscan accounts rarely leads to conversion of the infidel nor is it accompanied as is so often the case in earlier hagiographical accounts by any miraculous manifestation if the importance of preaching to infidels was written into the official franciscan rule of order the order did not demonstrate much interest in conversion and the primary efforts of friars in muslim lands were devoted to preaching not to the native populations but to the latin christians mercenaries merchants and captives living there franciscan attitudes toward conversion and martyrdom changed dramatically in the beginning of the fourteenth century however when accounts of the martyrdom of four franciscans said to have died while preaching in india were written the speed with which the accounts of their martyrdom spread had less to do with the world beyond christendom than with ecclesiastical affairs within macevitt contends the martyrdom of the franciscans shows how for franciscans martyrdom accounts could at once offer veiled critique of papal policies toward the order a substitute for the rigorous pursuit of poverty and a symbolic way to overcome islam by denying muslims the solace of conversion

Maidens, Magic and Martyrs in Early Christianity 2017-07-13

in this work jan n bremmer aims to bring together the worlds of early christianity and those of ancient history and classical literature worlds that still all too rarely interlock contextualising the life and literature of the early christians in their greco roman environment he focusses on four areas a first section looks at more general aspects of early christianity the name of the christians their religious and social capital prophecy and the place of widows and upper class women in the christian

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movement second the chronology and place of composition of the early apocryphal acts of the apostles and pseudo clementines are newly determined by paying close attention to their doctrinal contents but also innovatively to their onomastics and social vocabulary the author also analyses the frequent use of magic in the acts and explains the prominence of women by comparing the acts to the greek novel third an investigation into the theme of the tours of hell suggests a new chronological order shows that the christian tours were indebted to both greek and jewish models and illustrates that in the course of time the genre dropped a large part of its jewish heritage the fourth and final section concentrates on the most famous and intriguing report of an ancient martyrdom the passion of perpetua it pays special attention to the motivation and visions of perpetua which are analyzed not by taking recourse to modern theories such as psychoanalysis but by looking to the world in which perpetua lived both christian and pagan it is only by seeing the early christians in their ancient world that we might begin to understand them and their emerging communities publisher s description

The Book of Revelation presents a daunting picture of the destruction of the world complete with clashing gods, a multi-headed beast, armies of heaven, and the final judgment of mankind. The bizarre conclusion to the New Testament is routinely cited as an example of the early Christian renunciation of the might and values of Rome. But Christopher Frilingos contends that Revelation's relationship to its ancient environment was a rather more complex one. In spectacles of empire, he argues, that the public displays of the Roman Empire—the games of the arena, the execution of criminals, the civic veneration of the emperor—offer a plausible context for reading Revelation like the spectacles that attracted audiences from one end of the Mediterranean Sea to the other. Revelation shares a preoccupation with matters of spectatorship, domination, and masculinity.

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that in promising a complete reversal of fortune to an oppressed minority revelation has provided inspiration to christians of all kinds from liberation theologians protesting globalization to the medieval apostolic brethren facing death at the stake but frilingos approaches the apocalypse from a different angle arguing that revelation was not merely a rejection of the roman world in favor of a christian one rather its visions of monsters and martyrs were the product of an empire whose subjects were trained to dominate the threatening other by comparing images in revelation to those in other roman era literature such as greek romances and martyr accounts frilingos reveals a society preoccupied with seeing and being seen at the same time he shows how revelation calls attention to both the risk and the allure of taking in a show in a society which emphasized the careful scrutiny of one s friends enemies and self ancient spectators frilingos notes whether seated in an arena or standing at a distance as babylon burned frequently discovered that they themselves had become part of the performance

throughout its history persecutions and martyrdom have been christianity s faithful companions remarkably enough christians have always valued martyrdom in a positive way this positive evaluation of martyrdom most certainly has to do with the absolute uncompromising nature of it the martyrs lives and deaths represent the most uncompromising of answers to the divine call the focus of the contributions in this volume is not in the first place on reconstructing the historical events of the martyr s life and death wie es eigentlich gewesen ist but on the discourse generated by this event as mediated in texts more than a memory aims to explore the reciprocal relationship between this discourse of martyrdom and the construction of christian identity it will do so by presenting a number of test cases in which this dynamic can be seen at work they will lead the reader through the entire history of christianity starting with the martyrdom of lyons and vienne in the second century and ending in the latin america of the 1960 s each article will present a test case of discourse analysis attempting to explore the issue of how a document or coherent group of documents contributed to create a distinct christian identity taken together the essays provide an array of examples of how martyrdom impinged on the way christian identity has been negotiated in the christian past in doing

are christians meant to experience suffering this question has long been a contentious one within the church christ is risen the kingdom of heaven is at hand yet sickness poverty and persecution continue to be daily realities for christians around the world in this study of martyrdom and persecution in the early church rev dr kwaku boamah reminds us that there is no christianity without a cross and that suffering has played a prominent role in church theology and tradition since the time of christ examining second and third century apologetic texts and martyr narratives he utilizes a systematic comparative approach to create a holistic picture of the extreme challenges facing christians under the roman empire drawing parallels to the history of persecution and martyrdom in his homeland of ghana boamah locates the experience of african christianity firmly within the larger narrative of church history reminding christians that they are not alone in their suffering but are members of a global unified whole

between 850 and 859 christian era the muslim government of csrdoba ordered the execution of forty eight christians with few exceptions these christians invited execution by committing capital offenses some appeared before the muslim authorities to denounce mohammed others christian children of mixed islamic christian marriages publicly proclaimed their christianity coope investigates the origins of this martyrs movement in csrdoba then flourishing as a center of islamic culture she cites the fears of radical christians that conversions to islam were on the increase and that still more christians were being assimilated into arab muslim culture these fears were well founded and the executions further divided cordovan christians some believed the executed to be martyrs others argued that these were not martyrs but fanatics and troublemakers for their part the muslim authorities disposed to be tolerant would have preferred sectarian peace the martyrs were given every opportunity to recant

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using christian sources particularly the hagiographies of st eulogius and arabic accounts to understand the complex tensions in muslim spain between and among the muslim majority and christian minority coope presents a valuable and fresh view of this society at the apogee of al andalus muslim spain jessica a coope is an assistant professor of history at the university of nebraska lincoln

More Than a Memory 2005

one of the most traumatic experiences of late antique christians was the great persecution begun by emperor diocletian and his tetrarchic colleagues in 303 ce here aaltje hidding unites research of traditional memory studies with work done by cognitive scientists to examine how they remembered the persecution the resulting methodological framework the cognitive ecology systemically studies all what can be covered by this term social surroundings cognitive artefacts and the physical environment and bridges the gap between individual and collective memory the author analyses the remembrance of the persecution in three different regions along the Nile river in oxyrhynchus the thousands of papyrus fragments found at the city's rubbish dump give a vivid image of the martyrs in the daily lives of the oxyrhynchites in antinoopolis known for the cult of the physician saint colluthus she zooms in on the rituals and practices at a martyr's sanctuary finally in dandara the rich hagiographical dossier of the anchorite paphnutius shows how old memories of the persecution became mixed with new monastic experiences the bohairic and greek passion of paphnutius appear in their first complete english translations
